Message from Mrs Rawlins – 12.5.23

Next week in school:

Monday assembly: Next week is Mental Health Awareness week nationally. In our whole-school assembly on Monday, we will be spending a bit of time learning about how we can look after our own mental health.

Tuesday – Year 1 tennis festival: On Tuesday morning, our Year 1 classes will be taking part in a tennis festival at Chesterton Community College.

Tuesday at 3.25pm – Open Classrooms: You are warmly invited to come along to Open Classrooms from 3.25pm until 3.55pm, where you will be able to visit your child's class and they can show you a piece of work they are proud of!
