Providing release for strategic leadership of sport.	PE Curriculum Leaders (KS1 and KS2) have continued to work together to improve the overall quality of PE and school sports in our school. Year groups 1 to 6 attended sports festivals at Chesterton Community College and a group of Y6 children from our school running club attended the Cambridge Coleridge SSP cross-country inter-competition.
Paying support staff to run/support the running of clubs and competitions	We have continued to build on our club provision this year. Adult support has enabled these to run for free as well as guaranteeing a high level of pupil participation in both KS1 and KS2. 69% of children reported that they were involved in clubs in 2022/23. Providing free places for pupils in after school sports clubs	Continued club provision across the year groups. In KS1, we have provided several clubs including lunchtime including football and basketball clubs for Year 1 and Year 2 and a cricket club for Y2. There was also an after school Sport and Spell club targeting Y1 children who needed additional support with their phonics. In KS2 we ran Y3 and Y4 tennis clubs, a Y6 football and a Y6 cross country club. Cost: Included in Teacher/TA and sports coach costs
Swimming outcomes for children at the end of KS2	Swimming outcomes have been impacted by Covid-19 disruption. By the end of KS2 in 2023, 32% of children could swim competently, confidently, and proficiently over a distance of at least 25 metres, 34% of children could use a range of strokes effectively and all children learned about water safety and how to perform a safe self-rescue in different water-based situations Following the Y4 swimming lessons this year: 50% of children could swim competently, confidently, and proficiently over a distance of at least 25 metres, 45% of children could use a range of strokes effectively and 77% of children performed a safe self-rescue in different water-based situations
