### **Message from Mrs Rawlins – 15.10.21**

I write this at the end of another busy week at Arbury, just wanting to update you on a few things going on in school:

**Harvest assembly and Foodbank donations:** This morning, we had our video Harvest assembly in school, even though, like last year, it was sadly not at the Church of the Good Shepherd. Next week, we are inviting donations of items which we will pass on to the local Foodbank which operates from the Church of the Good Shepherd. Please see the attached information about the kinds of items the Foodbank is running low on (they have said they don't need beans or pasta, as they have plenty of these items). We will have a box in the KS1 and KS2 playgrounds from Monday to Friday for items to be collected. Thank you for your support of this important local service.
