Message from our Eco-Committee reps and Mrs Griffin: Last Friday, members of the Eco-Committee in Years 2-6 had a visit from Anglian Water to learn about water efficiency and how our water is managed locally. They had a brilliant workshop and would like to offer you three top tips about how to value and preserve our most important natural resource at home:

2. Check your taps and toilets for leaks and drips.
3. Turn off the tap while brushing your teeth – this could save around 12 litres of water every time you brush your teeth!

Mrs Griffin has asked any children who would like to do so, to design and draw a poster about litter to go up around school. Posters can be made at home and brought into school to be passed on to Mrs Griffin.
