## Message from Mrs Rawlins - 2.12.22

Can you believe that we are now in December... it really won't be long before it is the last day of term on Wednesday 21<sup>st</sup>! We have so much still going on in school. Teachers will be putting up Christmas displays after school today, showing different expressions of how Christmas is celebrated around the world – children have been busy creating items for the displays. Rehearsals are going really well for our productions, and we have had several different year groups out of school on trips this week. This morning, our Year 6 children are making chilli for their DT project. The KS2 corridor smells amazing and we know the children will enjoy sharing their chilli with family members when they take it home later (although some are saying they won't be sharing it!).

Christmas cards: Just a little reminder about children bringing Christmas cards for friends into school.
