Decorations for Arbury Court Christmas Tree: Classes in Year 1, 2 and 4 have spent some time today with Hilary Cox-Condron to create decorated sticks which will be made into stars for the tree which will go up in Arbury Court soon. I understand that the lights will be switched on in an event on Sunday 12th December, but I am not sure as yet what time it will be.
