It has been lovely to welcome everyone back to school for the Spring Term. It is our school birthday on 9th January, and we are now 68 years old, having opened on the 9th January, 1956. Friday afternoon - Maths workshop: At 2.30pm next Friday afternoon, 19th January, Miss Bright and Mrs Dowdall will be leading a Maths workshop for parents and carers of children in KS2. This workshop is a good opportunity to find out more about how we teach Maths in school and for you to ask questions. The workshop will be in the Expressive Arts hall – please come along to the door near to the main school entrance and we will let you in.
