Half-term ideas for families

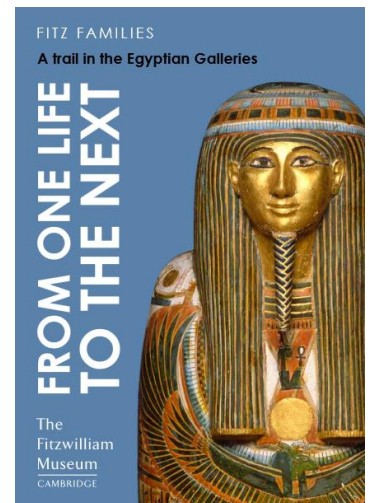
Please see below and overleaf some ideas of free or low-priced events organised for children and families over half-term and the coming weeks.

1. The tour with Allan Brigham visits The Guildhall, hears about the role of the Mayor and sees the Mayor's regalia. Visits the oldest building in Cambridge (pre Norman Conquest!). Ends inside Kings College Chapel.

3. Children need to be accompanied by a responsible adult.
