Safer Internet Day Information

Safer Internet Day this year is on Tuesday 11th February. Safer Internet Day is the UK's biggest celebration of online safety. Each year they cover an online issue or theme that speaks about the things young people are seeing and experiencing online. Created in consultation with young people across the UK, this year Safer Internet Day will be focusing on the issue of scams online and for young people, how to protect themselves and others, as well as what support is available to them. This year's theme is **'Too good to be true? Protecting yourself and others from scams online'**.

As a school, we will be marking this important day with Safer Internet Day assemblies and classroom activities throughout the week beginning Monday 10th February. Throughout the year, children at Arbury Primary School learn about staying safe online through special weekly 'Project Evolve' lessons and also in PSHE and Computing lessons.

At Arbury Primary School, we believe that keeping pupils safe online is very much a partnership between us in school and parents and carers at home. The internet is forever growing and changing and it is important that we work together to educate our children on how to stay safe and respectful when online.
